

DAY CAPTAIN'S MATCH REPORT

Oh, what a fantastic day. Under normal circumstances we only ever fish here, as a club in June, for the Pairs Competition, but as Meon Springs was called off due to low water levels we found ourselves here in November with a record number of 23 members, and four guests attending.

Starting off at the Crown Inn at 8am with an excellent breakfast we then made our way up to the fishery just after 9am by which time the sun was shining, and just a gentle breeze. Once we had all tackled up, a short briefing on the day's rules, and a warm welcome to our guests, and off we went. The fishery was split into four zones, everyone fishing each zone for 40 minutes, catch one fish, wait for the hooter then move to your second zone. Well as it happens 15 minutes would have been long enough, fish were being caught in all zones within minutes, rods bending everywhere. I think we all had a longish wait for the hooter to signify start fishing again, and so it continued throughout the morning. Strong fighting fish in superb condition, averaging near enough 3lbs. The ever-popular Blue Flash Damsel, in all its various guises accounted for many fish, Gold Ribbed Hares Ear, and Buzzers caught as well, and I am sure other patterns did OK. It was good to see a couple of Browns around the two, and half pounds, and the bailiff said there were some larger ones, but you needed to fish deep for them.

By the time we ended the zoned sessions just after 12 many had caught their limit and were now relaxing in the warm sunshine with their lunch. **Was this really mid-November?** This just left a few of us free roaming for the 1 or 2 fish needed to achieve their limit.

Steadily weighing in from around 1pm with assistance from Dave Martin, Colin Bateman, Brian Bloom, and Don Garner, **thanks guys**, everyone, apart from yours truly, had limit bags, accounting for 107 fish weighing 331 lbs, including one 5lb, 6 of 4lb plus, and quite a few 3lbs.

Best bag prize awarded to Don Garner, one of our guests, 16lbs 3oz, he also had the 5lb one. Although he also had the best fish club rules say you can only win one prize, so the next best fish of 4lb 12oz prize was awarded to Lynne Haskins.





A Little Tip:

Check your leader for wind knots

At this time of year when the wind tends to be stronger it's worth checking your leader for wind knots. They may look insignificant, but they can reduce the strength of your line by up to 40%.

Check your leader regularly for signs of wind knots and change your line if it's knotted, otherwise you may lose that fish especially if they smash the flies hard or if they happened to be above average size Fish.

Proper casting techniques minimise the likelihood of wind knots forming
