

#### **DAY CAPTAIN'S MATCH REPORT**

#### John O' Gaunt – 28 October 2023

This return visit to John O' Gaunt fishery for our Pairs Competition got off to a good start. The forecasted rain ceased as we exited the Crown Inn, Kings Somborne having enjoyed a full English breakfast, and it remained clear with sunny periods throughout the day.

With 21 of us fishing (Michael kindly stepped aside from the competition) there was plenty of space for us all on the two lakes. Following a short briefing at 0930 hours, everyone departed to their allotted zone with the usual catch and move procedure in place. I am grateful to Michael who acted as timekeeper and sounded the horn at the end of each 30 minute per zone fishing session. From about 1140 hours onwards, free roaming followed with lunch breaks taken at each individual's discretion. The water clarity was good, and with little wind and a bit of sunshine, it was occasionally possible to stalk individual fish.

It was not very long before rods were seen bending on both lakes with a number of very good fish netted. The fishing was consistent throughout the day although it was clearly a case of keeping on the move within each zone to find the fish and I suspect damsel fly variations dominated many individual catches. A variety of line and fly combinations were evident, and it was pleasing to note that everyone ended the day with their bag limit of 4 fish.

A total of 84 fish were weighed in for an impressive 260 lbs 13 oz. Congratulations go to Geoff Brooks and Lou Fine who won the pairs trophy with a combined weight of 34 lbs. Dave Cross and Lou Fine won the best fish prize, each with a fish of 7 lbs 7 oz and the best individual bag prize was won by Geoff Brooks and Bez Sahami, both with weights of 17 lbs 1oz. The detailed competition placings and weights are contained in the Secretary's report.

A very pleasant and enjoyable day for everyone with our grateful thanks to KEITH the fishery owner for his preparations which ensured we all had a successful and enjoyable day.



### A Little Tip:

## Fly Casting in Awkward Places

If you never bother to fish parts of rivers or lakes when there are steep banks, bushes or trees to interfere with castings and making the back cast impossible?


#### Then read on.

The solution is incredibly easy and will enable you to cover fish that are unlikely to have been spooked by other anglers and these fish are often the older, wiser fish. All you need to do is perform the roll cast and if done correctly your flies will be sent a long distance and into the path of fish.

Every fly fisher should know this cast because if you fish with a sinking or intermediate line the easiest way to get your fly to the surface at the end of the retrieve is to execute a roll cast immediately prior to the overhead cast. Practice it and then try it out on those fish that think they have found cover that is away from all the anglers.
