Meon Springs

We took the decision to hold our AGM at Meon Springs as Avon Springs no longer had the catering facilities for us. SORRY GUYS.

When the AA guy came for the second time, he Jokingly said perhaps I should stay here for the day, however he was kind enough to check all the other cars, and declared they were all OK.

Following agreement on the venues for the coming year I am now in the process of confirming the dates with all the fisheries, and as soon as these are confirmed will be sending out the Membership Renewal Forms. Bearing in mind our first outing is on 20th January at Albury Weston Lake. it would be very much appreciated if you would return them latest first week of January, please. Please book a minimum of 3 venues, more if you want, bearing in mind deposits can be carried forward if you are unable to make a particular venue.

Finally, we really need to look for at least 5 new members for the coming year. Colin is going to step up the Facebook info, without advertising, and if you meet other anglers at fisheries, you visit then why not tell them about SMFF. I had wondered if the bigger fish we're deeper in the water, the bailiff thought most of the colour in the water was being carried in the top layers so it would be a bit clearer deeper down. I abandoned Michael's white/orange monster after my first fish and changed to my reservoir sink tip line to get down deeper, using a flash worm and counting down 15 -20 seconds. The takes were very gentle, the fish seemed to just suck the fly in, so you didn't get a sharp pull just a gradual tightening of the line and that was a time to strike. I top bag but only managed Geokk Brooks.

SMFF AGM: HON SECRETARY REPORT

We held nine outings his year kicking off in January at **Avon Springs** due to the scheduled trip, and our AGM being postponed last December as the fishery was frozen. Unusually it did not fish well with the 19 attendees only catching 22 fish weighing some 70lbs.

Then to **Albury** in February, our first club outing there, with the 17 attendees weighing in 60 fish at 137 lbs.

March took us to **Manningford**, again with 17 attendees catching 57 fish at 134lbs.

April to **Rockbourne**, 23 of us had 82 fish weighing 291 lbs with a few doubles.

May to **Lakedown**, where we were delighted to welcome Charles Jardine for the day as we were supporting his Fishing for Schools project. 49 fish were weighed in at 99 lbs.

June to **JOG**, but after an hours fishing is was evident due to the high water temperature, and seeing so many distressed fish we decided, after talking to Keith who kindly agreed to let us return later in the year at no cost, to pack up and go home.

September to **Holbury**, again for the majority our first time there as a club. The 20 attendees caught 51 fish at 143 lbs.

Mid October to **Chalk Springs** with just 14 anglers catching 41 fish at 94 lbs. I believe having 2 outings just 2 weeks apart had a bearing on the poor attendance.

End October we returned to **JOG** with 21, everyone bagged up by lunchtime or before weighing in 261 lbs.

November saw us at **Dever Springs**, we had not been there for quite a while. 22 attended catching 35 fish weighing in at 190 lbs. including 2 doubles.

I am of the opinion we need to limit the number of anglers to 18 for the coming year, and have it pegged so everyone is moved around for the day. (Some Facts 9 outings not including today).

481 fish caught weighing a total 1,420 lbs.

Average attendance 19. Lowest **Chalk Springs** at 14, Highest 23, at **Rockbourne.**





A Little Tip:

Having a difficult day?

Tried everything? Here are 3 little tips that might just help.

1- Lose the crowds:

One certain thing to turn the fish off is too much human presence. If your fishery gets a lot of human traffic in certain areas, try and look for the quieter spots. This might mean a slightly longer walk or a trickier cast, but it could also mean better catches once you find where the fish feel safer. Finding a spot where the fish are less disturbed can often bring instant action.

2 - Smaller, subtler flies:

Another way to keep takes coming with wary fish. To a trout, for example, the difference between a size 10 nymph and a size 14 or 16 is huge. Think about fly colour too; if the fish are suspicious, trying something subtle is often the best way to go.

3 - Or just annoy them:

Of course, there's an exception to every rule and another way to outfox a fish that shows little interest is to annoy it! A black streamer such as the classic Woolly Bugger throws a nice bold silhouette. Mind you, flies with kicking rubber legs are also a useful gamble at times, with an even higher annoyance factor!

I wish to thank those of you who have taken on the responsibility of being Day Captains at our various outings for sending me your Day Captains reports. My thanks go to Joe Tufo for the many great photo's, to be honest without these there would be no Match Report. My thanks also to Michael Littlestone who's diligents when proof-reading the report has allowed me to rectify my many mistakes.

Without the help of you all I would not be able to produce our match report.
