

Weather: -On arrival 2°C, by midday 6°C low cloud and overcast all day with little or no wind

Condition of Lakes: Gin clear in both main lake and smaller top lake, no fish moving on the top until mid-morning when there were many rises in the center of the main lake.

Preferred line: - Intermediate / sink tip with fish around 2 – 3 feet down.

I have started the first Day captains report of 2023 in this format as it helps to quickly get a feel of what it was like on the day. Anne-Marie once again pulled out the stops with a wonderful tasty full English, thanks Anne-Marie.

We left the lodge at 9.30 having explained that as this was this first outing with 20 anglers, we decided to use a slightly different format. Rather than have a timed move from zone 1 to 3 we would each start in a different zone i.e., 7 in zone 1 and zone 2 and 6 in 3, but after catching the first fish, you were able to move to another zone without waiting for a timed hooter. When you caught on the next zone you then had to move to the final zone. If you caught in each of the zones you could fish in either of the two other zones. I was a little apprehensive initially about this, however as I caught my first three fish in reasonably quick succession in just over an hour, I did not have much time waiting around, which in the cold was a bonus. Unfortunately, I was the only one to achieve this B. My fourth fish however took a further 3 hours.

This day was unusual for Avon Springs as the weather and conditions were perfect and Barry usually stocks it very well for us. I did hear that it was stocked on Friday evening, which may account for the fact that most visible fish in the main lake were shoaling in a figure of eight in the center. As it was cold and we have had heavy frosts the ground was still frozen in places, most people opted for intermediates as I did, or sinking tips. I found that most fish I caught were in mid water and when I managed to get to the fish shoaling in the center, they either took it quickly on the drop or very soon after so I estimated they were just a few feet down. My chosen fly which netted me a personal best for Avon and my first three fish was a black Damsel with a red tail and Goldhead bead, generally fished at a medium jerky retrieve. See image below of my Personal Best at Avon of 11lb 14oz, a beautiful healthy specimen, which fought hard although all my fish did.

I did lose a couple of fish when I tried a slower figure of eight retrieve, but I imagined this was due to not engaging the barb sufficiently with such light takes. It was strange days fishing as in addition to catching my PB I also caught my smallest fish at Avon of just 2lb 2oz, my total bag weight was 19lb 5oz. Others also caught on a variety of Damsel variants including yellow and red heads. I was sorry to find after my 4 fish only Steve Argent caught 3 for a bag weight of 8lb 10oz, which came in second for the day. The next biggest fish was caught by Colin Bateman at 4lb 0oz. So overall as a club we did

not have a big catch just 22 fish with several blanks, total weight just 69lb 5oz. I think a number of members did struggle with the cold and grey weather although it did not rain. One point I forget to mention at the AGM is that I have negotiated a permanent discount with Sportfish / Farlowes of 10% using the discount code, easy to remember of " **SMFF** " depending on the amount you spend this raises to 15% with a voucher posted to you. 


A LITTLE TIP

Fly Line Care

When out fly fishing we all stand on the line or let it drop into the mud. Gradually a layer of dirt builds up on the line and dramatically reduces its efficiency. the line becomes much harder to cast and possibly even starts to sink.

The answer is very simple. After every 6 or so outings treat the line to a cleaner and conditioner. Simply pour some on a soft cloth and rub onto the line. You will be surprised at how filthy the cloth will become. Repeat and then buff the line. Try casting and it will be as if the line is turbo charged. Get into the habit of cleaning your lines often. It helps prolong their life, keeps them supple and vastly improves casting distances. Try it, you will be amazed at the results.







AGM SECRETARY'S REPORT DEC 2022

Following two difficult years where the Pandemic severely affected our fishing this year saw us achieve our full programme of nine outings, including today.

We returned to Lechlade at last, but despite having it exclusively 26 of us only managed 25 fish, of which ten were doubles, and as the price for this year is $\pounds 95$ + breakfast we think is becoming too expensive.

With our membership steadily increasing, currently 32 full members, 3 associate, and another 4 keen to join this coming season, we are well on the way to reaching our target of 40. Attendances this year averaged 23 up from 17 last year which was great. If it had not been for some confusion where a change of dates from those published at the beginning of the year it could well have been more.

Just a few facts, and figures. not including today. 8 official outings accounting for 457 fish caught weighing 1,547 lbs of which our last outing to John O 'Gaunt produced 107 of these, weighing 331 lbs with 27 anglers, a truly great November day out. The best fish so far this season was 18lb 12ozs at Lechlade to Bez. We all enjoyed our Anniversary Day at Rockbourne with the 25-attending catching 92 fish including 3 doubles, and recording the highest weight at any venue of 364 lbs.

As the hot dry Summer prevented us fishing a reservoir in September we went back to Chalk Springs, after an absence of 6 years. now under new management we were warmly welcomed and had some good sport.

If I have but one regret, it was not being able to have the couple of mid-week social outings promised. However, we most certainly will this year.

Our fixture list next season is now finalised and was going to be presented during this AGM for your approval. However, as the December outing was cancelled the list has been published on the membership forms already sent to everyone. We have added two new venues for the club, being Albury, and Manningford, and going back to Dever Springs. As many of you know, Duncton Mill, which so many of us have enjoyed has changed hands, at this present time we are unsure of the situation going forward, so does not appear on our fixture list at the moment. Let's see what happens.

In closing this report, Vic is standing down as Chairman, and my thanks go to him for his advice, and help during this past year when needed. To Bill for the fantastic newsletters he produces every month, and for the incessant, but kindly reminders if he is waiting for me to send him anything. Finally, my thanks to all those members who acted as day captains, assisted at the weigh ins, and helped to clear up afterwards.

Treasurer's Report for season 2022

Introduction

This will be the fifth year that I have had the honour to report on the state of the accounts for the club. This report covers the period 1st January 2022 to 31st December 2022. The books are, of course, open for inspection and are available.

Compilation of Accounts

Again, this year has, in the most, been steady from an accounting perspective and again nearly all membership transactions have used the BACS system of payments and the willingness of fisheries to accept internet and card payments has meant that real time records can continue to be maintained with easier reconciliation. I thank you all for your support in this. Having said that I continue to be prepared to accept all forms of payment that suit your individual wishes. I can again report that the assistance we have received from NatWest is commendable.

We balanced the books for the year to date finishing up with a small excess of income over expenditure. This excess is being used in part to fund the AGM costs and for payments made for fishing in December which of course we have carried over. These figures show that we have achieved what we set out to do a couple of years ago. That is to maintain a reasonable balance at the bank and at the same time balance the income over the year with the expenditure giving us the ability to provide subsidies and advance payments where this indicates a buffer against rising prices.

We started the year on an even keel and we have finished this period with a slightly raised amount at Bank. We have only two small creditors and we are holding deposits and payments against the cancelled December AGM. The figures are comparable with last year's so the club can be said to be balanced in its dealing and able to hold its own.

A balance sheet showing the position on 31st December 2022 has been produced and is available to members.

Into the Future

As we planned the programme for 2023, we as a club, have been able to continue to support meets in the same way, bearing in mind fishery costs are rising and we have been lucky to have been able, to keep the costs down for the time being and provide subsidies for a number of meets. We have also, where required by the fisheries, paid deposits to hold prices at today's level. We are holding the subscription as last year but increased the draw prize to reflect the cost of travel to a venue.

I would like to thank you all, again, for your cooperation and support over this past year and this, being my report, I commend it to you.
