


St Michael Fly Fishers Match Report



The day started cloudy and grey with an unseasonably warm temperature of about 11C. This rose, once the sun broke through late morning to about 16C! I was accompanied for the first time in 6 months by our honourable Treasurer Kevin Doherty who is about to start his Chemotherapy and was looking forward to seeing you all and grabbing some fresh air. He was very warmly welcomed by everyone and we all wish him a successful recovery.

With 21 attending I wanted to ensure that everyone got a try on all of the lakes (with the exception of the smaller Alder). To that end I decided to split the fishery into 4 zones Birch Rosie 1, Rosie 2 and Coot with three zones before hearty breakfast in the club house. Fishing commenced at 8.30 with a move every 40 minutes. We had been advised by Martin Fleetwood (Fishery Manager) that most of the fish that had been spooned were full of buzzers and this was quickly established by many who caught on a variety of flies from Montana's to Hares ears and Dawl Bachs. Whilst the fish were not particularly large they were beautifully formed with large shovel tails and a beautiful bar of silver colour. Most of the fish were caught in water of at least 3 foot deep.

We adjourned for breakfast at 10.30 with almost 2 dozen fish having been caught. Most anglers fished with floating lines (having heavy flies and long leaders) although a number including myself, used intermediate/sinking tips or Full Hi'd lines. I used a full HiD fast sink line in the hope of catching an elusive Char, for which I failed. I did bag four lovely small Rainbows, all with great tails, that fought harder in some cases than some of the much larger specimens at our last outing to Lechlade. I tried various flies, but found with a floating single fly and most successfully a small green and black.

After breakfast, we all went back out for a further zone, which after 40 minutes was followed by free roaming. We were grateful to Martin and his wife Caroline for a very good breakfast and wonderful homemade cakes.
