

#### DAY CAPTAIN'S REPORT

### Our day commenced with a wonderful breakfast at the Crown Inn, Kings Sombourne. "A great way to start the day".

As we were fishing today for The John Fullers Pairs Trophy it was important that I had all the pairs rules sheets sorted in preparation for the day's festivities. Unfortunately between printing them all off and the final count on the day I had to change pairings around twice, apologies to members for any confusion or discomfort as a result, especially if your partner changed and he won with his new partner, sorry for possible spoiler!

The weather started very brightly unlike the forecast for cloud cover temperature at 18C with little wind just enough for a small ripple. After the briefing and group photo we set off for the three zones two on the main lake and the small gin clear lake as the third zone. Unlike past years when many caught on one of the first few casts this time out it took a lot longer before word of the first fish to pass around, in fact more than half did not catch on the first zone, very unusual for JOG. There was a wonderful display of a variety of Damsels and Dragonflies on the water with the odd sighting of Mayfly, which boded well for the day's activities.

It was soon clear that a lot of the fish were in fairly deep water on zone three, theses were down as deep as 6-8 feet forcing a number to use heavy flies and long leaders. There was, as usual an abundance of advice as to best tactics, especially for those less fortunate that after fishing the three zones, to not have caught their first fish, myself being one of these! The flies used varied from the most common, of course being THE BLUE FLASH DAMSEL, through to pheasant tails, daddies, cat's whiskers and the odd buzzer or two. After 4 hours of exhausting my fly box of a variety of light medium and very heavy flies and having been broken twice, it was my first visit to JOG without catching a fish, at least no fish to dispose of, clean or smelly nets!

However unlike past years where everyone bagged up by 1.30 this time only 7 anglers caught their 4 fish, 4 caught 3 fish and the remaining 5 caught only one or two fish. I do not think this was the fault of the fishery but rather the very warm water temperature and bright sunshine.

There was a bit of a mix up during the weigh-in as the Club scales were out of action, but it was eventually sorted out and order was restored. The pairs competition was won by the days new pairing of **Dave Broome** and **Vic Holloway** with a combined weight of 27lb 9oz, they will receive their trophy at the AGM at Avon Springs in December.
