Lake one had a little colour in it, you can usually see the bottom; but the inlet was running hard and not much chance of spotting fish apart from the occasional one nearer the surface.


Lake two – the most favoured and proved most productive, with the deeper bottom end working to a retrieved fly, although our sleuths picked up quite a few close in and under the trees.

Today **St Michael Fly Fishers Club** is made up of a few founding Staff Members and Friends of Marks and Spencer and is proud that it has reached its 30th Anniversary. This milestone event for the club was celebrated by holding an Anniversary fishing and social event at Avington. "The great thing about reaching the 30th year is being able to look back over the many years remembering all the great days the members past and present have spent together fishing".

In the early years when we fished the Itchen, there was one occasion when one of our members having caught his very first salmon, was so pleased he decided to 'jump in' the river to celebrate sadly the Club was not allowed back to this Fishery for many years...! We have had so many amusing events to look back on as a club, bringing joy and comradeship to each of our members over the years. These days the Club fishes a number of still water fisheries and reservoirs that are selected to deliver a consistent, and challenging fishing experience. Its annual calendar of events includes enjoyable In-Club Competitions. In terms of fish caught, our Club records show our heaviest fish was a 20lb+ Rainbow from Avington, a 12lb 8oz brown from Chalk Springs and a 8lb 8oz brown from Bewl Water.

The Clubs 30th Anniversary event at Avington more than met expectations with members catching some fine fish an enjoyable afternoon tea followed by a presentation of prizes for the biggest fish, the biggest bags of the day and the secret weight prize.
