Day Captains Report

In eager anticipation of our last outing of 2016 most anglers arrived at Lechlade in the dark, some before 7.30am, the car park can get a bit busy but it was still dry when we arrived! The water temperature, we were advised was just under 7° c with the air temperature at 11° c, so conditions were set well for what should have been a plentiful days fishing.

We set off at 8.30 after a short briefing, fishing three zones with 35minutes per zone prior to stopping for a hearty breakfast at 10.30. The light rain started just after 10 so we were pleased for a brief respite over a great breakfast. In the first session, a number of good fish were caught mostly by the boat jetty and in front of the house in the small lake. Once again there did not seem to be a common denominator for the most popular catching flies, through the day these ranged from Cats Whiskers, Blue Flash Damsels, Silver & Black lures a variety of Black Damsels and Minkies plus Black & Green. I had a frustrating time after catching my fish, a 9lb 9oz rainbow on a silver and black lure, having drawn a blank through the remainder of the session and before going out on the boat I chose a Black Minkie style lure with a bright yellow luminous bead, by this time the rain had set in and was dark and overcast. On the first cast with the fly and just after starting a retrieve I had my biggest hit of the day it had my adrenaline flowing for 2 seconds, but the fly and the leader tip was smashed off, a rookie mistake not spotting a wind knot, in spite of there being no wind! It was a tough day as the rain became progressively heavier, but still no wind,

On the boats after breakfast there were mixed fortunes, Bez and our honourable Chairman did well with three fish including two doubles, others fared better from the bank including Vic Holloway with a wonderful 9lb 8oz brownie for a bag of 33b 12oz for his four fish. Only four members bagged up including Mike Stephens with a 11lb 9oz double (bag total 34lbs) just beaten to the biggest fish by Dave Newman who caught just the one fish, but a cracking 12lb 13oz. The winner on the day was once again our most consistent angler David Broome for a bag of 36lb 12oz. It was a day of mixed fortunes as many members caught fish. a total of 44 fish recorded weighting 367lbs for an average weight of 8lb 6oz!

As we are trying to share the prizes at each event, we have now introduced a secret weight prize in addition to the biggest bag and largest fish and this was won by our newest member Matt Vice for a two fish bag of 19lb 15oz.

Well done to everyone on what was a tough day with the cold and damp, it was I feel the case that the falling pressure was enough to turn a lot of the fish off, as the fish were very much in abundance on the day.

Have a wonderful Christmas and tightlines for the New Year see you at Lechlade on February 25th.

An influx of new members who want to come out and fish on a regular basis has ensured we are able to have all our venues for exclusive use. It certainly shows today with 25 of us attending, I think the best ever. In fact I have had 5 apologies as well. We could have been fishing shoulder to shoulder.

As of today we have 34 members all of whom have attended events this season, and at least another two new members hopefully joining us next season. All being well we could reach our target of 40 in the coming year.

During 2016 have had 9 competition events, plus today's non competition one, making the average attendance 19 and a bit, well that is what my computer say's, on a few occasions some guests have joined us to increase that number. We weighed in a total

of 1,628 lbs not including today, with 458 fish brought to the scales.

It was decided to use the John Fuller Pairs trophy at John O'Gaunt, which was originally designated for a reservoir outing, but not awarded for the past two years as so few members wanted to fish reservoirs. It is good we can award it today. It is also good to see the

trophies spread around with eight members sharing the spoils, and the handicap system appears to work well.

Financial Report

In Kevin's absence the Financial Report was presented by Joe Tufo. It was decided not to give the full details of the financial report in this match report as the information is for members eye's only and should not be available for just anyone who may visit our web site to see. December 10th 2016 Hon Treasurer Kevin Doherty – presented by Joe Tufo

The key points for this years report are that we once again have a healthy balance at the bank in line with last years figure and in spite of a number of expenses this year.

The balance takes into account :-

The cost of the calendars – these were sponsored in part by Dever Springs, Lechlade and Chalk Springs with each member given one at the AGM Web site costs

Marketing, including Advertising in Trout and Salmon magazine to attract new members, plus we printed and distributed a number of flyers at fisheries we attend.

Subsidising a number of events during the year including the AGM **The cost of all this years prizes**

The raffle once again has been a great aid in retaining our healthy balances as it contributes to a lot of the prizes and the members are thanked for their support of this with purchasing of the tickets and also donating prizes for the raffle. As we are entering our 30th Anniversary year we hope you will be able to continue supporting it in the New Year as we are hoping to improve the winners prizes plus adding the secret weight prize at each event. This coming year we are also subsidising the Family day at Bushyleaze with a breakfast and a lunchtime Barbecue. There will also be other events that we will offer a lunch these will be notified prior to the events.

It is essential we regularly bring in new members hence the recent marketing activity we would remind members that if a member outside the committee introduces a new member the following year (after a full years membership) the member will have receive a 50% subsidy to his membership fee. We currently have approximately 35 active members and we need to get this up to at least 40. This is essential in maintaining numbers at each venue otherwise we lose exclusivity at an event and also the donated Day Ticket. The Day ticket will in future, feature as the biggest bag Prize at each event.

We are planning two possible sea fishing excursions (separately from the clubs normal activities), these will coincide with the events at John O'Gaunts to Lymington on June 9th and Chalk Springs with either Brighton or Littlehampton on September 15th being the Fridays before the fly fishing event. To avoid members dropping out, the full amount will now need to be paid in advance. With more than a dozen showing interest in this next year I will make the necessary arrangements and send out an email circular in the early New Year, there will only be one boat of 8 for each venue on a first come first served basis.
